**3 THINGS TO DO BEFORE YOU CAN GET YOUR NEW BOOK**

- See that the particulars on your present Identity Card and Food Ration Book are up-to-date and that they agree. If you have moved, or changed your surname, don't alter the card or book yourself. Take both to the Food Office immediately.
- Fill in page 3 of your present Ration Book (the Reference Leaf). Don't forget section "Y" including signature of the book holder, and section "Z" if under 18.
- On page 4, the back of the Reference Leaf, write the name and address of your present Milk supplier. On page 5 of the Child's (green) Book write in addition the names and addresses of the child's Meat and Egg retailers.
